A School Snapshot

This week is British Science week and the children have enjoyed being Scientists and taking part in some exciting investigations. Waves Class have been modelling how the Earth rotates and orbits the sun.



Shell's class have been learning all about how plants grow and when they need to grow successfully. We have two experiments which are ongoing at the moment. We have all individually planted some bean seeds and we have been watching and recording its growth over time. We have also done an experiment around if plants need sunlight. We have put four of the same plants in different place in the classroom, with differing access to light. We are monitoring these to see any changes which occur.
