CORONAVIRUS (COVID 19) FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Dear parents and carers,

After conversations with parents I feel I should clarify the position regarding school attendance and self-isolation.

What to do if	Action Needed	Your child cannot return to school until
your child has coronavirus symptom(s).	 Your child must not come to school. You must advise the school of the symptom(s) of your child. Your child (and your household) must self-isolate. Your child must have a test within 24 hours. You must advise the school of the results. You must update the school every 3 days thereafter 	after your child has received a negative test result and you have advised the school of the result, Or after your child has self-isolated for 10 days from when your child's symptoms started. (Your child must not return to school before the 10 days have elapsed unless a negative test result has been received).
your child tests positive for coronavirus.	 Your child must not come to school. You must advise the school of the test outcome as soon as possible. Self-isolate for a further 10 days from test result 	after 10 days (if s/he feels well enough) even if s/he still has a cough or loss of smell/taste. These symptoms can last even when the virus has gone and the person is no longer infectious.
somebody in your household has coronavirus symptom(s).	 Your child must not come to school. Your child (and your household) must self-isolate. The household member must have a test within 24 hours You must advise the school of the results. 	after the household member has received a negative test result and you have advised the school of the result, Or after your child has self-isolated for 14 days from when your household member's symptoms started, unless your child becomes symptomatic – then please follow the guidance as above.
somebody in your household has tested positive for coronavirus.	 Your child must not come to school. Your child (and your household) must self-isolate for 14 days. 	after your child has self-isolated for 14 days from when your household member's symptoms started, unless your child becomes symptomatic – then please follow the guidance as above.
NHS have identified any adult in your household as a 'close contact' of somebody with symptoms/confirmed coronavirus	 You child should still attend school. The adult must self-isolate for 14 days. The adult must not accompany pupils to school. 	after the adult has self-isolated for 14 days, and has not developed symptoms they can return to accompanying pupils to school.
you have received medical advice that your child must resume shielding	 Your child must not come to school. You must provide evidence to school pertaining to the shielding. Once shielding restrictions are lifted/paused, you must inform pastoral staff of the day your child will return to school 	after the shielding restriction has been lifted/paused.

Please note: When a family member tests positive, the whole household must self-isolate for 14 days. When a family member has symptoms the whole household must isolate until a negative test result is received or for 14 days, providing they do not become symptomatic. Absence from school under these circumstances will not count against your child.
