Your school is making a commitment to improve its focus on your community's wellbeing. To do this effectively we need to hear from you! This is important because sometimes we think we are doing everything we can, but it's not always as accessible and helpful as we had planned. There are three stages to the audit: The first is gaining as many responses from just 6 questions - you'll soon see a link to the questionnaire coming very soon. The second is to run 3 focus groups - one made up of our children, one of our parents and carers and another from our staff and governors. You'll have an opportunity to share your interest in joining the focus groups via the first questionnaire. These focus groups will analyse the results from the questionnaires and think further about how the school is doing. The third is to form a working group from members of these focus groups to understand where we are and to action plan our next year ahead to keep the good, good and improve the not-so-good!

They even wrote a story through the school with each class writing a plot point. We will be turning this into our very own book to share with you at home. The children looked fantastic on World Book Day. They made a huge effort to decorate their bags and dress up as characters from stories. We had a fun day exploring books and making our own pop-up books. We have finished our Great Fire of London topic. The children have impressed me with the interest they have shown and the knowledge they have retained. They have put together questions to ask the fire service when we visit them today. This trip will be the finale to our topic and we will be replicating the Great Fire by burning the Tudor houses we made in DT.

The children were inspired by Andy Goldsworthy's work to create beautiful sculptures this week using natural resources. The children demonstrated skill and imagination.

Starfish

First of all, a warm welcome to Mrs Russell who has joined the Starfish team this week. A recent highlight was World Book Day and we must say a big thank you to Starfish parents for sending the children in such creative book inspired costumes. Well done to the children for designing and decorating their bags. A selection are now on display.

We've now finished our Beowulf writing unit and have moved on to writing instructions about how to make a sundial. When we actually get a sunny day, we will be able to put our instructions into practice. This English topic fits very nicely with our Science unit of, 'Light' which we have been studying for the last few weeks. Our next Science unit is, 'Forces and Magnets' which we will start in British Science Week which is next week.

Yesterday, we started our unit of, 'Fractions' in Maths. Any support you can give at home would be much appreciated. It is a good excuse to have a cake or pizza and divide them into equal groups discussing the fractions. Keep it simple at first, focussing on halves and quarters.

You will see from the pictures that the children finished their pneumatic monsters. I'm sure you'll agree that they did a splendid job and they certainly enjoyed themselves in the process.

Footprints



We have had some awesome days in class over the last few weeks. Firstly, we couldn't forget about World Book Day where the children spent some of the day creating publishable books (barcodes included!) of their Beowulf ' A New Terror' stories. We have also completed our Design Technology learning around pneumatic mechanisms (see photographs) which were also themed around Grendelthe beast from Beowulf.

In our writing, we have explored instructions and followed a set to make origami boats. We hope they are helping the children to develop a calm mind before bedtime by resting it on their tummies and watching it gently rock back and forth. We are currently writing instructions on how to create a calm mind. These instructional writing skills will also be put to use in Science where we are beginning to explore electricity.

In maths, we have begun our journey of fractions. This has so far proved to be challenging and we have taken our learning right back to basics. Please jump on any opportunities at home to reinforce basic unit fractions (1/2, 1/3, 1/4, 1/5 etc) as well as equivalent fractions (1/2 = 2/4). This term our KIRF is around fractions too!

We are looking forward to the photography day at the Lizard on Tuesday 22nd and our rescheduled rugby tournament on Tuesday 29th March!

Waves Class have had a wonderful last couple of weeks and the time has just flown by. They have all worked incredibly hard and have produced some wonderful work in all areas of the curriculum. We finished writing our powerful, persuasive pitches about plastic pollution with fantastic results. The children worked really hard to get the important message across.

We have started a new unit of writing based around the book Gorilla by Anthony Browne. We have been using emotive and adventurous vocabulary to create wonderful pieces of dream like narrative. After half term we will continue our work on this unit and write our own version of the story.

On Friday afternoons the halls of the school have been filled with the delightful sweet sound of ukulele music. The class have really been enjoying their weekly lesson and have made great progress. They have learnt the names of the strings, how to pluck and strum and we are now beginning to put some notes together to play a song.

During World Book Day, we wrote our own mini sagas and published mini books. They are magnificent. We loved sharing our favourite books in class too, and we were all very impressed with the book bag designs.

We have also been learning about how our circulatory system works in Science, and discussing how to live a healthy lifestyle. We have been improvising on our glockenspiels to Make You Feel My Love in music (we preferred the Bob Dylan version to Adele) and creating pieces of artwork inspired by Henri Rousseau. We have even had a go at a couple of sample SATs papers, so we know what to expect and how to prepare. The children took on this challenge with great maturity. Well done Surfers!
