There has been much written and talked about the new Netflix programme Squid Games and the levels of violence portrayed within it. It is now producing games for the Roblox platform. Many of the children are telling us that they have access to Netflix at home and some are saying they watch the series. This programme has been identified as one that is unsuitable for primary aged children with some local authorities writing directly to parents about the dangers of children watching this violent programme and mimicking its content on playgrounds and out of school.

We have also sent an E-safety newsletter to you that gives advice on how you can put parental controls on computers and phones. This is very simple to do and gives you information on what your children are accessing on phones and through the internet.

Pebbles have been busy this month. Our routines are in place and it feels like the Reception children have always been part of our class. The completion of the garden has meant that we can enjoy being outside during all weather.



For Black History month we focused on teaching the children about diversity and inclusion through reading the books The Colour Monster, Mr Big and Mixed, taking part in music, dance and drama activities and learning how to mix colours using primary colours.

We have been learning that we live in Mullion which is a rural and coastal village. The Year 1 children walked around the village and identified human and physical features. We looked at Google Earth to see where Mullion is in relation to the World. The children were surprised to see how much of the World is ocean.



The class have made super progress in phonics and are enjoying being able to read by themselves. Our maths this half term has focused on number, counting how many, counting forwards and backwards, recognising number patterns and making comparisons.

In Science we have been learning about the different parts of the body and the children were able to name a huge amount of body parts.


