Year 6 are busy rehearsing for their end of year performance and assembly. It doesn't seem long since they were in Reception. Wow doesn't time fly!



Summer Reading Challenge









The Summer Reading Challenge is back. It's the biggest reading for pleasure programme for children aged 4 to 11 delivered via public libraries. Children can sign up at their local library or online. Last year, in Helston, **255** children joined the Challenge.

How it works:

- Children sign up through their local library and receive a collector folder.
- They set a reading goal and borrow books of their choice during the summer, collecting special stickers and incentives.
- Library staff and volunteers help children to discover new books that suit their interests and reading level and run a programme of free themed activities in the library.
- Children who complete the Challenge are presented with a certificate and/ or a medal. You could organise **a special assembly to present the certificates** in the new term.
