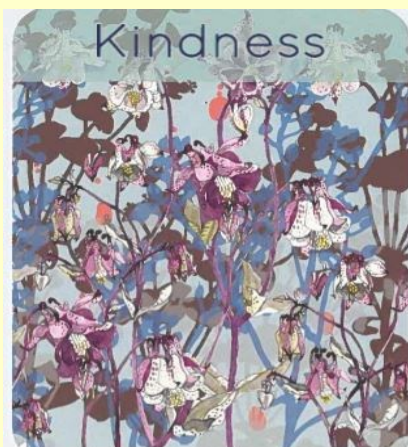

This week we have had a maths focus, specifically learning about shape and measurement. The year 1 children have taken part in practical activities exploring 2D and 3D shape, measuring mass, capacity, weight and length. The Reception children have enjoyed lots of time in our outside area demonstrating their previous learning in a range of activities. We are very proud of the progress children have made in their phonics and we appreciate the support for reading from parents at home. On Tuesday we spent the afternoon learning about Christianity for RE. We visited the Methodist Church and met with the Minister who explained objects around the church and their significance to Christianity. The children listened to a story from the bible about Easter. After that we went to the Church of England Church and looked at the Easter displays. The children were fascinated by the elaborate woodwork of the pews and other objects. We were fortunate to arrive while the handbell team were practising. The children enjoyed listening to the lovely sound they made.

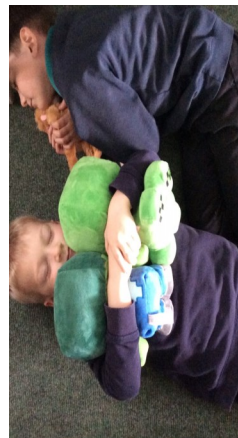
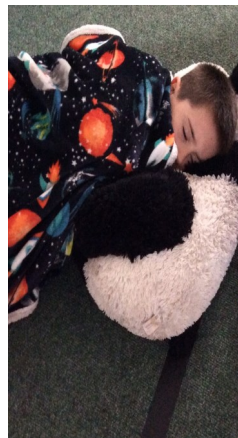
It's been a fun filled first week back after the Easter holiday. We have continued our unit of fractions in Maths by focusing on finding fractions of amounts - eg. $\frac{3}{4}$ of 32. The children are becoming more confident and will soon be ready to move onto equivalent fractions.

Some of the pictures show our, 'Experience lesson' for English. For our writing based on the book, 'Wolves in the Wall' by Neil Gaiman, the children role played feeling nervous and frightened, then discussed techniques that they could use to comfort themselves. As you can see, teddies played quite an important part!

Bread making is our current Design Technology topic so we started the unit by exploring varieties of bread from different countries. Naan, pitta, bagels, baguettes, chocolate brioche, garlic, red onion and chive, gluten free etc. were all tasted and commented on under various categories such as appearance, smell, texture and taste. It's hardly surprising that the chocolate brioche was a firm favourite and the red onion and chive not quite as popular!

Footprints

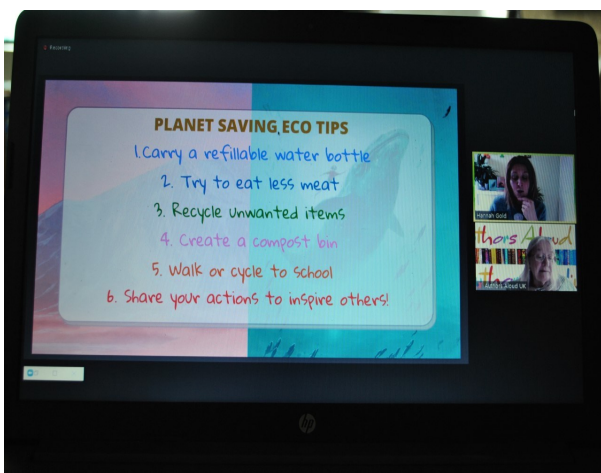
