



# Key Instant Recall Facts

Year 4 – Autumn Term 1

I can count in multiples of 25 and 1,000

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts.  
The aim is for them to recall these facts **instantly**.

## Counting in multiples of 25:

25, 50, 75, 100, 125, 150,  
200, etc.

## Counting in multiples of 1,000:

1,000, 2,000, 3,000,  
4,000, 5,000, 6,000,  
7,000, 8,000, etc.

## Key vocabulary

What is the third multiple  
of 25?

How many groups of 25  
equal 200?

How many 1,000s makes  
8,000?

## Top tips

The secret to success is practising little and often. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey? You do not need to practise them all at once; perhaps you could have a fact of the day. If you would like more ideas, please speak to your child's teacher.

## Practical resources

- Use what you already know – If your child knows how to count in multiples of 50, they can use this knowledge to count in multiples of 25 as half of 50 equals 25. E.g.  $2 \times 50 = 100$  so  $4 \times 25 = 100$
- Chant multiples of 25 or 1,000 together.
