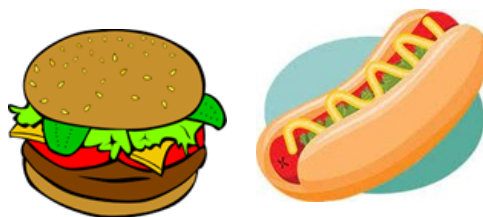

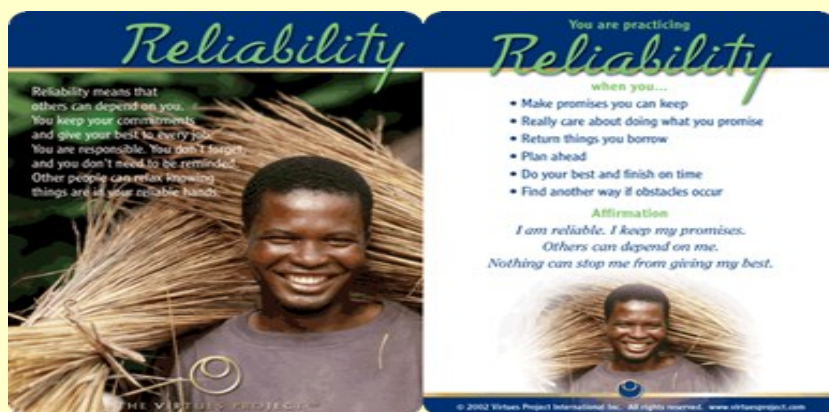

Throughout the course of the day, the children had the opportunity to explore all the museum had to offer: from using binoculars at the lookout point, the spotting sea creatures in the sub-zero level, and meeting monsters of the deeps to sitting on RNLI beach buggies.

There were two elements to the workshops, led by the experts at the museum. Firstly, we learnt all about The Vikings as clever craftsmen and traders. They made some amazing jewellery and practical items to trade with other countries. We explored all the amazing spices Asia had to offer the Vikings in exchange for their items.

We also learnt that the Vikings absolutely LOVED shiny things and would trade for silver in any form! We all made a silver Viking coin to take home - I hope you've still got it and haven't used it in the Co-op!!

Lastly, we saw a model of a Viking longboat and watched how they used the wind and sails to travel to other countries. We had a go at using the wind machine to sail our own boats too! It was much harder than it looked.

The children all had a great day and represented the school brilliantly. What a pleasure it was to take them. Well done Year 3 and 4!!
