

Year 5 Junior Life Skills Trip

On Wednesday afternoon Waves Class had the opportunity to visit Falmouth Fire Station to take part in a Junior Life Skills event. There were workshops provided by Cornwall Council in partnership with the RNLI, Cornwall Police, NHS, Fire Service, Bike it!, Great Western Railways and local bus companies.

They learnt all about: delivering CPR, preventing choking, cycling safely, using local buses and trains, beach safety, fire prevention and the importance of not dropping litter,



picking up dog poop and where to (or not to) park. In fact, all Waves are now expert traffic wardens, so beware! We even had an unexpected rescue from a locked toilet by the fire service. Luckily, we were at the Fire Station!

What an eventful afternoon.
