
School Council News




Mental Health Week continued...

Before half term, the children took part in a range of activities to kick start our new toolkit for positive mental health and emotional regulation. This week, they have all learnt about 'the fizz' which is a way of describing the physical (or fizzical) sensation of the emotions in the body.



How we **think**, affects how we **feel** and that affects what we **do**.

The Decider life skills is a toolkit for how to respond to 'the fizz'. We all feel it, it's natural, and we need to learn how to regulate the feel into the right actions.
